[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]



No warrant has issued for the services of Thomas Hitherly in the revolutionary War  
Land Office S/ C. Blagrove, Reg.  
January 20, 1810

Hereby Certify that Thomas Hitherly was a Soldier in Captain John P Harrison's Company to which Company I was attached in the year 1778 that He Behaved as a Good & faithful Soldier & that I Believe he served for 3 years the Term for which he was enlisted though I cannot ascertain the fact not having possession of the Company Book and all the other officers of the company are dead.

Loudoun County Commonwealth of Virginia to wit

This day Samuel Dunlap<sup>1</sup> Aged fifty-three years made oath before me the Subscriber a Justice of the peace for the County aforesaid that he the said Samuel Dunlap Enlisted under Captain Peyton Harrison of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Regiment during the War, & that he was well acquainted with Thomas Hetherly [sic] who was a Soldier in the same Company & Regiment; & that the said Thos. Hetherly Enlisted for the Term of three years & is certain that the said Thos. Hetherly Served the said Term of three years and was regularly discharged. Given under my hand September the 1<sup>st</sup> 1809
