


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof [name illegible] in the [illegible] regiment, having faithfully [sic] served in the United States [several illegible words] and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the [?]th July[?] 1783
By order of the secretary at war, [Benjamin Lincoln]



Recorded in the books of the regiment,

I Adam armstrong do acknowledge that Jeremiah Watkin has [illegible word] me full satisfaction for the above Discharge as witness this 20th of oct'r 1784[?] Adam hisXmark Armstrong

War Office, [blank space] 1783.

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.
