Pension Application of Jesse Curtis R2601

Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[The pension application is missing from the file, probably having been sent to District Attorney Washington G. Singleton who investigated many pensioners and applicants from Lewis and other counties of present West Virginia. For details see pension application S6111 of David W. Sleeth.]

Lewis County

Jesse Curtis aged 74 yrs. Serv'd 2 yrs. 9 mos.

John Mitchel [pension application S5761] a Magistrate of Lewis County aged 71 yrs. has known Curtis for twenty years. thinks him too young to have been a Soldier in the Revolutionary War. Curtis told Mitchel "that he had not been in the Revolutionary War as a soldier.

William Powers [S18164] a Magistrate of Lewis County aged 70 yrs. has known Curtis for many years. Says Curtis is too young by many years to have been a Soldier in the Revo. War. - Jesse Curtis told me that he had not been in the Revo. War nor has he applied for a Pension.
