Pension Application of Hugh Cane S34676

State of Maryland Frederick County Sct

On this seventh day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the fifth judicial district of said state personally appeared Hugh Cane aged 64 years, resident in Ann Arundel [sic: Anne Arundel] county in said state who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he, the said Hugh Cane enlisted in March 1778 in the state of Maryland in the company commanded by Captain John Egleston [sic: John Eccleston] of the Second Maryland Regiment commanded by Colonel [Thomas] Price belonging to the service of the United States; that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States for the term of three years, when he was discharged from service, that he was in the battles of Monmouth [28 Jun 1778], Stoney Point [sic: Stony Point, 16 Jul 1779] and Guilford Court House [15 Mar 1781] when he was discharged and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
