[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]


Know all persons That it may Concern That I Susannah Cammeron [Susanna Cameron?] Administratrix of Joseph Cammeron's Deceased Estate of the State of Virginia Henry County have bargained and Sold unto Jarratt Patterson of the above County all the Right and Title to a Negro That was promised as a Bounty to my son John Cammeron [John Cameron?] that was killed at the Battle at the Eutaw Springs [September 8, 1781],<sup>3</sup> as an insinagement [sic, incentive or enticement?] for his Enlisting into the South Carolina Ten months service, and I Desire Those that may have the Trust of paying the Above Bountys to pay the Bounty that was promised John Cammeron Deceased to the before mentioned Jarratt Patterson, and his receipt shall be a Sufficient discharge for the same. Witness my hand 5<sup>th</sup> day of January 1782
