[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

[p 2: Printed form of Indent No. 2166 Book X dated July 3rd, 1778 “delivered to Mr. Cornelius Dysart this our Indented Certificate, for the Sum of Nine pounds thirteen Shillings & four pence Sterling Arrears of Clothing due to him for his Services in Sumter’s [Thomas Sumter’s] Brigade per Certificate from the Commissioners for Adjusting the Claims of the said Brigade.”]

[p 3: Reverse of the above Indent bearing endorsements by Thomas Sumter Junior, Philip Hart, and Moses Spitz, but none by the Veteran. How these gentlemen acquired an interest in the Indent is not disclosed by the documents in this file.]

[Note: All of the other documents in this file are illegible as posted except for an Indent No. 310 Book O dated April 14th 1785 and delivered to Mr. Cornelius Dysart for £316 Sterling for medicines supplied to the Army in 1781 and an instruction signed by Cornelius Dysart asking the commissioners to deliver that indent to Mr. Sampson Simons.



Whether or not the Cornelius Dysart who delivered medicine to the Army is the same man who served in Sumter’s Brigade, is not disclosed by the documents in this file.]
