



- 2) Capt. John Eustace BLWt682-200, who was killed at the Battle of Brandywine on 11 Sep 1777.
- 3) Lt. John Eustace VAS1322 who enlisted in 1780 and was discharged on 1 Jan 1783. He was evidently assumed by the Pension Commissioner to have been the husband of Sinah Lee. Sinah Lee may have been mistaken about the rank of her husband.
- 4) Ensign John Eustace of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Reg., commissioned on 7 Oct 1780 and served to the end of the war. There was a Capt. John Eustace in the 1<sup>st</sup> Virginia Continental Regiment in May 1777 who may have been either 1) or 2). (There was also a Major John Skey Eustace who was evidently different from all the above.)

A document in the file states that "Mrs Sinah Lee widow of John Eustace, a Lieut. & Ensign," died in July 1851.
